- Less than 90 School Disciplinary Absences for the 2022 year.
- 85% Level of Achievement A-C for Years 7 10 across all subjects.
- 100% QCE/QCIA
- 100% graduating students with a VET certificate.

#### LITERATE LEARNERS

To improve the level of achievement of students in years 7 - 12 through the teaching of literacies and cognitive verbs across the curriculum through embedded learning experiences.

Use standardised testing such as PAT – R, PAT – M and PROBE testing to identify students requiring additional literacy support. Use small group/individual targeted interventions to improve student outcomes.
